Nutrition Aid Program

According to UNICEF, one in three children in the country are malnourished and this has caused widespread stunting of their growth. Together with the parents, we started a humble nutrition aid program that our limited resources could afford.



With the help of some donors from the US, gummy vitamins are now given daily to the children. Periodic distribution of bags of fortified powdered milk will follow.



We also gave each family a copy of our 3M Mini Cookbook with special "Masarap, Masustansiya, Matipid" recipes compiled by Geline Lim in 2016 from her round-table sessions with UCH parents.
